

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE
TOWNSHIP OF STOWE, COUNTY OF ALLEGHENY, COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA,
HELD ON TUESDAY, July 14, 2020, IN THE MUNICIPAL BUILDING,
555 BROADWAY AVENUE, MC KEES ROCKS, PA 15136.

The Regular Monthly Meeting of the Board of Commissioners of the Township of Stowe was held on Tuesday, July 14, 2020, in the Municipal Building, 555 Broadway Avenue, Mc Kees Rocks, PA 15136.

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Parrilla, who led in the Pledge of Allegiance, then a Moment of Silence in honor of all Veterans and First Responders.

ROLL CALL: Present were Commissioners Derzic, Parrilla, Cropper-Hall, Glowacki, Chestnutt, McDermott and Rugh. Also, present were Solicitor Bradley Matta, and Secretary Nicholas Martini.

ENGINEERS REPORT: Township Engineer Veronica Bennett was unable to attend this meeting but her report discussed the following items: Race Street parking, and Woodward Ave parking lot cost estimates are being looked into and are going to be put out for bid soon. The Fleming Avenue Stormwater Improvement Project is nearing competition, but the contractor has not been doing any work. Work is expected to be continued if possible, legal action may need to be taken if necessary, or project extension may also be required. ALCOSAN will agree to any extension due to these circumstances. The tunnel way project grant extension approved, Allegheny Places SALDO grant, has slowed and is going to be looked into as to why the work has grinded to a halt, and will ask for extension if necessary. Curling Club work is near completion pending some final inspections, and should be open soon. Application will be submitted to the PA DCED for a blight remediation grant to help the township tear down blighted and abandoned properties. Application is due by July 31st.

Motion by McDermott, seconded by Chestnutt to accept receipts, was approved, by an 7-0 vote.


