# REPORTS

FINANCE - Presented by Commissioner.

**PUBLIC WORKS** – Presented by Vice President Chestnutt

Commissioner McDermott brought up two (2) items:

- 1) to have J. Marcink look into of being able to make Erie Street at Fleming Ave where no trucks are allowed due to the area being narrow and a pole near roadway.
- 2) Asking to put on the agenda to complete Davis Street above Stowe Ave, approximately 1,150 yards that was never repaired and cannot be patched anymore. Cost would be approximately \$30,000 \$36,000 to repair. Consider using some COVID funds to help with this expense.

On another note, an "Oldies in the Park" has been set for Island Heights Park on Saturday, August 19<sup>th</sup> from 3-7pm. DooWop Dan will be DJ. "Pretty Parties" will be selling baked goods and food trucks are being looked into. All are invited to work on bringing the community together for a night of fun and music.

POLICE – Deputy Chief C. Wilker presented. Detective N. DiMichele spoke about a class that he and DC Wilker went to concerning drones. They would like approval to get donations and/or grants for purchasing a drone along with training needed. Several examples were given concerning why a drone is good in certain circumstances. It is a good resource and a good tool to be able to use (e.g. a lost child/person; when a suspect takes off; getting into or seeing into a home where it is unsafe for an officer to approach, etc).

# FIRE DEPARTMENT - Vice President Chestnutt presented

- **ORDINANCE** Vice President Chestnutt presented. Stated that interviews for a Code Enforcement Ordinance Officer will begin on Monday, August 14<sup>th</sup> at 3pm. There are five (5) candidates who will be interviewed.
- **PLANNING COMMITTEE** –Next tentative meeting is set for Thursday, August 31st at 7pm. No meeting was in July
- **SOLICITOR** B. Matta presented. Received a letter from the Attorney General's office on collecting statistics. It does not affect Stowe Township, it is only statistical information. He will be working with Secretary R. Farls on getting this information into them.

The advertising for the demolition hearing has been advertised. It will be held Tuesday, September 12<sup>th</sup> at 6pm before the regular Commissioners Voting meeting.

**ENGINEER** – (at the voting meeting) J. Marcink. On September 9<sup>th</sup> the CDBG Year 50 opens up so we need to begin thinking about what we are able to apply for.

Concerning the lower Highland paving, Jeff will be checking with the COG and a possible TEAMS meeting to discuss. Going to work on getting an estimate of what the paving of that road will cost. Will also check to see what open and/or pending grants they have.

MS4 program the waiver has been submitted.

Concerning rental inspections backlog – KLH can offer assistance in the interim. They will be used as needed and charge \$65/hr. They are here to help however they can.

1156 Dohrman – the owner would not have to see if there is asbestos if he tears it down. The Township would need to check. A demo permit would possibly be needed. Jeff to talk to Dennis, KLH Code Enforcement

Davis Street (under new business item J) looking at doing a 2-inch overlay with asphalt; scratch coat then 1 ½ inches wearing course for drivable surface. Will need to request bids for project. Possibly use COVID funds, if able.
